

JAPANESE LANGUAGE

OBJECTIVE:

The goal of this course is for the students to gain knowledge of basic Japanese grammar, and to acquire basic Japanese language skills (listening, speaking, writing, and reading). By the end of this course, the students will be able to communicate short messages on highly predictable, everyday topics that affect them directly. The students will be able to read a limited amount of information from highly predictable texts in which the topic or context is very familiar. They will be able to meet limited basic practical writing needs using lists, short messages, postcards, and simple notes.

PRE-REQUISITES:

The course is built for beginner level, although prior knowledge would help.

OVERVIEW:

Japanese is an East Asian language spoken by about 128 million people, primarily in Japan, where it is the national language. It is a member of the Japonica (or Japanese-Ryukyuan) language family, and its relation to other languages, such as Korean, is debated. Japanese has been grouped with language families such as Ainu, Austroasiatic, and the now-discredited Altaic, but none of these proposals has gained widespread acceptance.

Little is known of the language's prehistory, or when it first appeared in Japan. Chinese documents from the 3rd century recorded a few Japanese words, but substantial texts did not appear until the 8th century.

- Gives a better insight and understanding of a new language.
- Makes the learner proficient with the basic LSRW module of the language.

- understand the essentials of grammar and syntax;
- understand short texts in the target language
