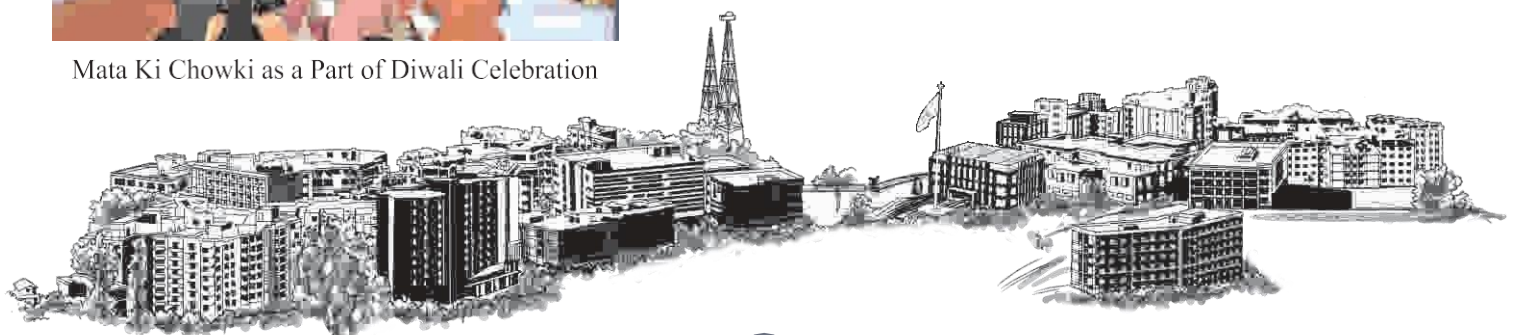
DIWALI CELEBRATIONS 2019

Question: What are your expectations about the university and its improvement ?

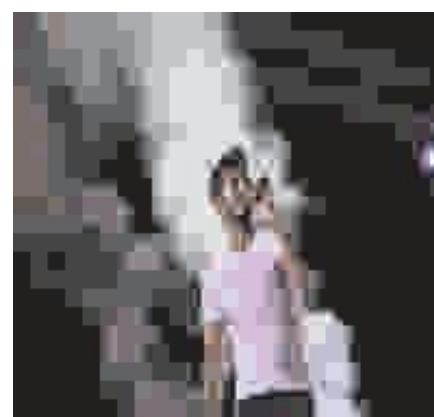

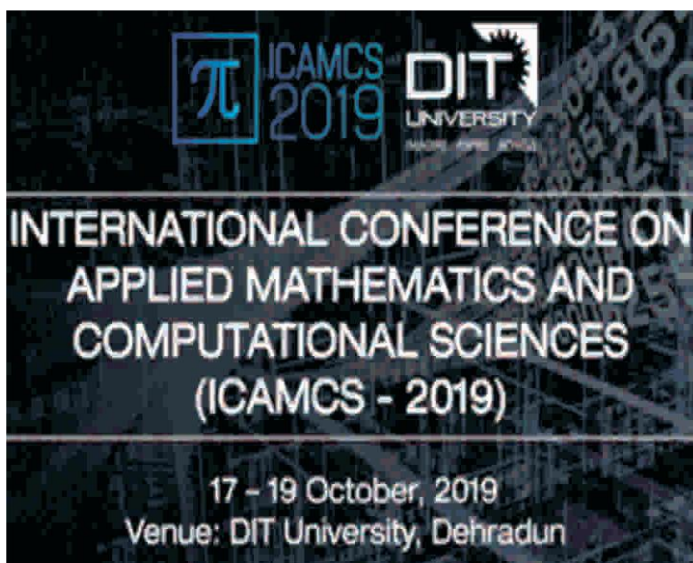
