Everyone with their own theories was a winner with the praise showered by the faculty members and motivation to keep working hard in the development of their respective schemes.



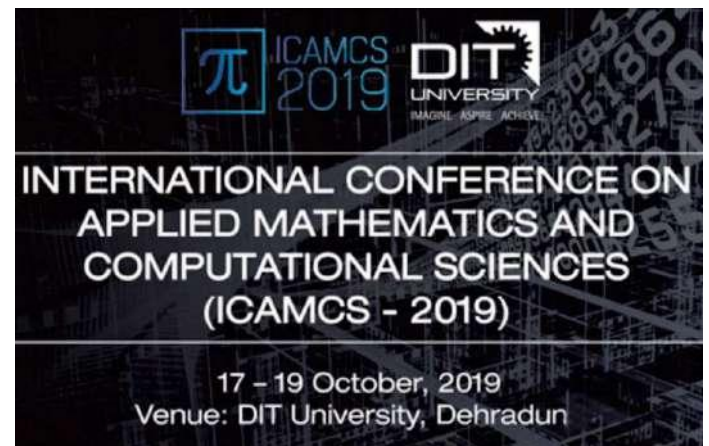

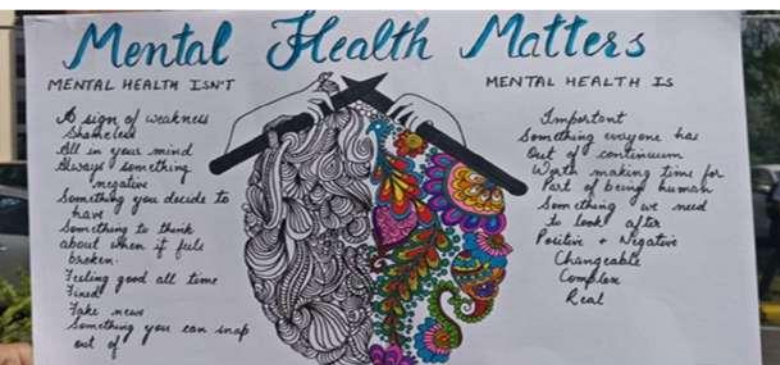
