1 HOW ARE YOU FEELING AFTER JOINING UNIVERSITY?

Well, I am both new and old to DIT. New because I have come in an as the chancellor within the trend work of the university, old because I have actually seen DIT as an institution in the sense that way back in 2000, I used to be education secretary in the state. At that point and time I remember the university authorities came to meet me, to perhaps continue as a part of UP technical university because Uttranchal was formed at that point of time and there was a need to have continuity and perhaps they felt that new state has come into place and we may be part of Garhwal university because we are in Garhwal. We felt that okay let this continue without disturbance. From what was DIT college, a constituent college of the UP technical university. I have seen it grow subsequently and this whole process of the university, as both secretary education and secretary to the governor of the state, I had the opportunity to work on legislative measures for the creation of private universities in this field. The first institution that came up in this case of the legislature was Dev Sanskriti Vishvvidyalya, so which is in Haridwar. Subsequent with that three more universities had come up,

that was the UPES, University of Petroleum and Energy Studies, then ICFAI University and Himgiri Vishvvidyalya, these were the three universities. This was all in the period between 2002 to 2007. I used to be secretary to the chancellor or secretary to the governor in the period 2002 to 2007. So, I was subsequently out of the state, when I came back by the time I learned many more private universities had come up in the state DIT, IMS etc had become universities. So, I am both old and new.

2 HOW WOULD YOU DESCRIBE THE STUDENTS HERE?

I would like to say young mind should have a sense of 'imagine, aspire and achieve'. It's the credo of the institution. So, when you come to this institution, you must be fired by an imagination as our former President Mr.Kalam use to say "Dare to Dream". You should be fired by an imagination. Classrooms are just one aspect of learning, it's beyond classrooms that you need to look at and when you work as a team I would say let's say this AAROHAN team, what you are doing is, you are grouping together and forming what is called a team. So a team is where people come together for a common purpose and try to achieve a common goal. So, I would like to describe the team . T E A M:- Together Everyone Achieves More, so that's how I look at the word team. Because when you go into the real world ultimately it's the team that works whether it's on a project whether It's in the arms forces whether you work in the public administration or whether you go back to academics where different levels of teachers work together.

WHAT CHANGES YOU ARE HOPING TO SEE THE NEAR FUTURE IN THE UNIVERSITY?

See, there are 2-3 things that I would like to see at the university. One, I would like to have a startup culture because the national priority is Startup India, Make in India etc. So, I think startup culture is very much needed. Of course, there are a lot of places to improve, some more, some less. But startup culture is important to bring out the entrepreneurial drive within students. So I think this is one area we need to work. Second, I would like to see that students have a much rounded educational system, meaning, classroom is important but communication skills are even more important. So you need to have the art of negotiating, the art of communicating, the art of presenting. These are all important aspects. See, these all jobs you come across into the real world is all about buying and selling. So, there are buyers and there are sellers. The seller is the one who is able to market his or her products well. The buyer is one who selects preferences etc. So, you have to understand that this is the real world. You may be selling software products, you may be selling architectural plans, you may be selling electronic goods, doesn't matter. At the end of the day there are consumers and there are producers. So, that's why they use the broader term buyers. In that aspect, human needs have to be understood and the human requirement has to be met.

WHAT DO YOU LIKE MOST ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY?

I like the location.

1 HOW DO YOU FEEL ABOUT THE PROGRESS OUR UNIVERSITY HAS MADE?

I am pleased because every year we are getting meritorious students for admission and DIT is becoming a brand to reckon with. Wherever we go today people recognize you as DITian that means it is the student's efforts, efforts of faculty, it is all of us together who work as a team to take DIT into a different level of excellence. So I would personally say that I am very happy, satisfied but yes, we have a long way to go and we have so many challenges to conquer and I am sure that together we can make it happen.

WHAT DO YOU THINK MAKES US DIFFERENT FROM OTHERS?

There are several parameters, one is the type of training that is important in the DIT University system. Our focus in due course of time shall be on project-based learning. We are giving a lot of emphasis on outcome learning through projects. We are also planning to have the start-up subjects either in the 7th semester or in

the 8th semester. It is being discussed in the academic meeting, I'm sure that very soon you will have a new structure which is with the choice-based credit system. We have already implemented it from 2017/2019 batch for 3rd and final year. We are fine-tuning it, making it powerfull. It's where the faculty inputs come, industrial input comes so that we have a synergy between academic and industry and where it can help students to do the value-added projects there.

WHAT HAS BEEN THE MOST CHALLENGING PART WHILE YOU HAVE BEEN HERE?

Well, I have been in the academics for over 3 decades before coming to DIT. I always love to be with students and my success is through the student communities. For that, I'm very happy. The challenges have been that of the transformation from an affiliated university to a university because in the affiliated university it's the academic council, the syndicate, the bodies, they decide about it. But here we have that flexibility, the autonomy to think about what is good for our students. But friends, autonomy comes with responsibility. I'm very happy to share with you that each one in the system own the responsibility. So you see the changed DIT today is because of the efforts of each one of us, the students, the faculty, the staff, every stakeholder and I would also say that the parents have also appreciated so many initiatives that we took in DIT University. Some students did come to me when it comes to the processing examination system. We have schedule the academic calendar timely. You know well in advance that when is what and how you have to prepare for it. I do believe that we have not changed anything in the academic calendar in the last 3 years.

WHAT DO YOU THINK ABOUT THE STUDENTS OF DIT UNIVERSITY?

I would say that they are very good, fabulous and fantastic. Every word goes for appreciating the students because we admit students on the basis of merit. We know that we get a diverse group of students from all across the country. Currently the student strength is around 6,000. I would rather say, larger section comes from outside the state. Therefore, I'm happy they hybridize. First, they share knowledge and come with noble ideas which is going to put them in their career much ahead of others. Second, the placement scenario is also very encouraging. All the process that we put in place in academics has to be vindicated by someone. So, who authorizes it? It's the industry. If you look at the placement of this year 2018 for 2019 pass out batch, it has been fabulous and that vindicates that the process that we are putting in place is being appreciated and recognized by the industry otherwise there would have not been this overwhelming response. For about last 2 months every day, there were at least two companies in campus and selecting our students. It's the students choice Now whether they want to go to company A, B or C. It has improved a lot which is very satisfying for me in particular and the institution, that yes, our values, in academics our methodology of training is giving us the dividends through our corporate partners. We are also very happy that many industrial teams from various groups have come here. Recently we had the IBM team and they were so satisfied with the process that we have. We have signed a couple of MOUs with various institutions abroad. We are soon going to have a student exchange program.

ANY MESSAGE FOR THE EDITORIAL BOARD?

You are doing a wonderful job and try to refine the process from time to time. You should break the monotony, come out with new and creative ideas. There should be innovation and my suggestion is, make some space available for others to view your comments on it and what events we are holding every month, every day makes a report of that and I think it should be lucid like a document which everyone will love to read and not throw in the dustbin.
